

**To delegates and participants of 3rd International Automotive Workers Conference**

**Proposed structure for country reports:**

- Presentation of the country, nature of the government, role in international competition (e-mobility, etc.), size of the automotive industry (number and type of companies; number of automotive workers and suppliers; are they part of international production networks, and if so, which ones?)

- Current situation of automotive workers, under what conditions do they produce, are there attacks on wages, working hours, collective agreements, health and safety at work, what methods of oppression, political attacks, etc.

- Impact of production on the working and living conditions of the population and families

The reports should focus on the current disputes and struggles of automotive workers and the specific problems that need to be solved:

- What were you fighting for, what were your main demands, and what was achieved?

- How did you fight? What forms and methods of struggle were developed? How did the auto workers deal with empty promises and illusions? What particular experiences of struggle does your automotive workers' movement have? (Is there international cooperation among auto workers, e.g., within the corporation?)

- What questions or problems arise in organizing auto workers and their families?

- Who are the allies, e.g., from the anti-militarist and anti-fascist struggles; is there experience from these struggles?

**The country reports should last 5 minutes. They should be submitted in English by October 15 and, if possible, presented as a PowerPoint presentation.**
